## SUBSTITUTE FOR HOUSE BILL NO. 5737

A bill to amend 1994 PA 451, entitled "Natural resources and environmental protection act," by amending sections 43517 and 43520 (MCL 324.43517 and 324.43520), section 43517 as amended by 2018 PA 399 and section 43520 as amended by 2018 PA 4.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

1 Sec. 43517. (1) A parent or legal guardian of a minor child or

2 a guardian of an adult who has a developmental disability or

intellectual disability shall not permit or allow the minor child

4 or adult who has a developmental disability or intellectual

5 disability to hunt game under the authority of a license issued

under this part except under 1 of the following conditions:

(a) The minor child hunts only on land upon which a parent or

- 1 guardian is regularly domiciled or a parent or guardian, or another
- 2 individual at least 18 years old authorized by a parent or
- 3 guardian, accompanies the minor child. This subdivision does not
- 4 apply under either any of the following circumstances:
- 5 (i) The license is an apprentice license.
- 6 (ii) The minor child is less than 10 years old.
- 7 (iii) The minor child is an individual who has a developmental
- 8 disability or intellectual disability and is unable to obtain
- 9 certification of completion of training in hunter safety.
- 10 (b) If the license is an apprentice license, a parent or
- 11 quardian, or another individual at least 21 years old authorized by
- 12 a parent or guardian, who is licensed to hunt that game under a
- 13 license other than an apprentice license accompanies the minor

- 17 the minor individual hunts only with a mentor in compliance with

- 29 is unable to obtain certification of completion of training in

- hunter safety, the adult hunts only with a mentor in compliance

- 4 (2) By September 1, 2012, the **The** commission shall issue an order under section 40113a establishing a mentored youth hunting program. The order must provide for at least all of the following:
- 7 (a) A mentor shall be at least 21 years of age before8 participating in the mentored youth hunting program.
- 9 (b) A mentor shall possess a valid license to hunt, other than
  10 an apprentice license, before engaging in any mentored youth
  11 hunting program.
  - (c) An individual shall not be a mentor unless he or she the individual presents proof of previous hunting experience in the form of a previous hunting license, other than an apprentice license, or certification of completion of training in hunter safety issued to the individual by this state, another state, a province of Canada, or another country.
    - (3) As used in this section:
  - (a) "Developmental disability" means that term as defined in section 100a of the mental health code, 1974 PA 258, MCL 330.1100a.
  - (b) "Intellectual disability" means that term as defined in section 100b of the mental health code, 1974 PA 258, MCL 330.1100b.
  - Sec. 43520. (1) Subject to other requirements of this part, the department may issue a hunting license to an adult who has a developmental disability or intellectual disability, has a guardian appointed under chapter 6 of the mental health code, 1974 PA 258, MCL 330.1600 to 330.1644, and is unable to obtain certification of completion of training in hunter safety, or to a minor child if all of the following requirements are met:

- (a) A parent or <del>legal</del> guardian of the <del>minor child</del> **individual** applies for the license on behalf of the <del>minor child</del>.
- 3 (b) The parent or guardian represents that the requirements of4 section 43517, as applicable, will be complied with.
  - (c) The license fee is paid.

- 6 (2) A person authorized to sell hunting licenses shall not 7 issue a hunting license to an An individual born after January 1, 8 1960 shall not purchase or attempt to purchase a hunting license, 9 unless the individual presents proof of previous hunting experience 10 in the form of a hunting license issued by this state, another 11 state, a province of Canada, or another country or presents a 12 certification of completion of training in hunter safety issued to the individual by this state, another state, a province of Canada, 13 14 or another country. If an applicant for a hunting license does not 15 have proof of such a previous license or a certification of 16 completion of training in hunter safety, a person authorized to 17 sell hunting licenses may issue a hunting license if the applicant 18 submits a signed affidavit stating that the applicant has completed 19 a course in hunter safety or that the applicant possessed such a hunting license previously. The person selling a hunting license 20 shall record as specified by the department the form of proof of 21 the previous hunting experience or certification of completion of 22 23 hunter safety training presented by the applicant. This subsection 24 does not apply to the issuance of an apprentice license or mentored 25 hunting license. An apprentice license, mentored hunting license, or the equivalent does not satisfy the requirements of this 26 27 subsection concerning proof of previous hunting experience.
  - (3) An individual who does not meet the requirements of subsection (2) may obtain an apprentice license for the same price

as the corresponding regular license that the individual would 1 otherwise be qualified to obtain. An individual 17 years old or 2 older shall not hunt game under an apprentice license unless 3 another individual at least 21 years old who possesses a license, 4 5 other than an apprentice license, to hunt that game accompanies 6 that apprentice licensee and does not accompany more than 1 other 7 apprentice licensee. For the purposes of this subsection and 8 section 43517(1)(b), an individual shall not go along with more 9 than 2 apprentice licensees of any age for the purpose of 10 accompanying those apprentice licensees while those apprentice 11 licensees are hunting. If an individual has represented to an apprentice licensee or, if the apprentice licensee is a minor 12 child, to the apprentice licensee's parent or legal guardian that 13 14 the individual would accompany the apprentice licensee for the 15 purposes of this subsection, the individual shall not go along with 16 the apprentice licensee while the apprentice licensee is hunting unless the individual actually accompanies the apprentice licensee 17 18 and possesses a license, other than an apprentice license, to hunt the same game as the apprentice licensee. An individual is not 19 20 eligible to obtain a specific type of apprentice license, such as a deer license, a base license, or a turkey license, for more than 2 21 22 license years. An apprentice license must be distinguished from a 23 license other than an apprentice license by a notation or other 24 means. 25 (4) Only a minor who is less than 10 years old, a minor child
