Analysis

Summary

House Bill 4276 would establish Holocaust Remembrance Week in the State of Michigan in memory of the victims of the Holocaust and in honor of the survivors, rescuers, and liberators. The intent of the Legislature would be that the twenty-seventh day of the month of Nisan, in the Hebrew calendar, be declared as Holocaust Remembrance Day in Michigan, and that the period beginning on the Sunday before that day and ending on the following Sunday be declared as the Days of Remembrance. Individuals, educational institutions, and social, community, religious, labor, and business organizations would be encouraged to pause on Holocaust Remembrance Day and during the Days of Remembrance to reflect upon the events of the Holocaust.

Fiscal Impact

House Bill 4276 would have no fiscal impact on the state or on local units of government.
