## **HOUSE BILL No. 5296**

November 30, 2017, Introduced by Reps. Yaroch, Lucido, Hertel, Sabo, Cochran, Yanez, Green, Sowerby, Chang and Brann and referred to the Committee on Insurance.

A bill to amend 1969 PA 317, entitled "Worker's disability compensation act of 1969," by amending section 405 (MCL 418.405), as amended by 2014 PA 515.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 405. (1) In the case of FOR a FULL-TIME, PART-TIME, PAID
- 2 ON-CALL, OR VOLUNTEER member of a fully paid fire department of an
- 3 airport operated by a county, public airport authority, or state
- 4 university or college; a FULL-TIME, PART-TIME, PAID ON-CALL, OR
- 5 VOLUNTEER member of a fully paid fire or police department of a
- 6 city, township, or incorporated village; employed and compensated
- 7 upon a full-time basis; a FULL-TIME, PART-TIME, PAID ON-CALL, OR
- 8 VOLUNTEER member of a fully paid public fire authority; employed

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- 1 and compensated upon a full-time basis; a county sheriff and the
- 2 deputies of the county sheriff; a member of the state police; a
- 3 conservation officer; or an officer of the motor carrier
- 4 enforcement division of the department of state police, "personal
- 5 injury" includes respiratory and heart diseases, or illnesses
- 6 resulting therefrom, that develop or manifest themselves during a
- 7 period while the member of the department is in the active service
- 8 of the department and that result from the performance of duties
- 9 for the department.
- 10 (2) A FULL-TIME, PART-TIME, PAID ON-CALL, OR VOLUNTEER member
- 11 of a fully paid fire department or public fire authority who is in
- 12 active service of the fire department or public fire authority, has
- 13 been employed 60 months or more in the active service of IN the
- 14 department or public fire authority at the time the cancer
- 15 manifests itself, and is exposed to the hazards incidental to fire
- 16 suppression, rescue, or emergency medical services in the
- 17 performance of his or her work-related duties with the department
- 18 or authority shall suspend a claim HE OR SHE MAY HAVE against his
- 19 or her employer under this act and may claim like benefits from the
- 20 first responder presumed coverage fund created under subsection (6)
- 21 for any respiratory tract, bladder, skin, brain, kidney, blood,
- 22 thyroid, testicular, prostate, or lymphatic cancer. The cancers
- 23 described in this subsection are presumed to arise out of and in
- 24 the course of employment only with respect to a claim against the
- 25 fund and in the absence of non-work-related causation or specific
- 26 incidents that establish a cause independent of the employment.
- 27 Neither mere evidence that the condition was preexisting, nor an

- 1 abstract medical opinion that the employment was not the cause of
- 2 the disease or condition, is sufficient to overcome the presumption
- 3 for purposes of a claim against the first responder presumed
- 4 coverage fund. The presumption under this subsection may be
- 5 rebutted by scientific evidence that the member of the fully paid
- 6 fire department or public fire authority was a substantial and
- 7 consistent user of cigarettes or other tobacco products within the
- 8 10 years immediately preceding the date of injury, and that this
- 9 use was a significant factor in the cause, aggravation, or
- 10 progression of the cancer. The suspension of the member's claim
- 11 against his or her employer under this subsection is in effect only
- 12 during the period the member receives like benefits from the first
- 13 responder presumed coverage fund. If a redemption agreement between
- 14 the first responder presumed coverage fund and the claimant is
- 15 approved, the suspension of a claim against an employer under this
- 16 subsection continues indefinitely. A claimant may not receive
- 17 benefits covering the same time period from both the first
- 18 responder presumed coverage fund and the employer. The presumption
- 19 created in this subsection applies only to a claim for like
- 20 benefits against the first responder presumed coverage fund. FOR
- 21 PURPOSES OF A CLAIM AGAINST THE PRESUMED COVERAGE FUND, A FIRE
- 22 DEPARTMENT OR PUBLIC FIRE AUTHORITY IS CONSIDERED THE EMPLOYER OF A
- 23 VOLUNTEER MEMBER.
- 24 (3) Respiratory and heart diseases or illnesses resulting
- 25 therefrom as described in subsection (1) are presumed to arise out
- 26 of and in the course of employment in the absence of evidence to
- 27 the contrary.

- 1 (4) As a condition precedent to filing an application for
- 2 benefits, a claimant described in subsection (1) or a claimant
- 3 under subsection (2) shall first apply for and do all things
- 4 necessary to qualify for any pension benefits to which he or she,
- 5 or his or her decedent, may be entitled or shall MUST demonstrate
- 6 that he or she, or his or her decedent, is ineligible for any
- 7 pension benefits. If a final determination is made that pension
- 8 benefits shall WILL not be awarded or that the claimant or his or
- 9 her decedent is ineligible for any pension benefits, then the
- 10 presumption DESIGNATION of "personal injury" as provided in
- 11 subsection (1) or the presumption under subsection (2) applies. The
- 12 employer or employee may request 2 copies of the determination
- 13 denying pension benefits, 1 copy of which shall be filed with the
- 14 workers' compensation agency upon request.
- 15 (5) If an employee described in subsection (1) or (2) is
- 16 eligible for any pension benefits, that eligibility does not
- 17 prohibit the employee or dependents of that employee from receiving
- 18 benefits under section 315 for the medical expenses or portion of
- 19 medical expenses that are not provided for by the pension program.
- 20 (6) The first responder presumed coverage fund is created as a
- 21 separate fund in the state treasury. The state treasurer may
- 22 receive money or other assets from any source for deposit into the
- 23 fund. The state treasurer shall direct the investment of the fund.
- 24 The state treasurer shall credit to the fund interest and earnings
- 25 from fund investments. The director shall be the administrator of
- 26 the fund for auditing purposes. The director shall expend money
- 27 from the fund only for the purpose of paying claims authorized

- 1 under subsection (2) and costs of administration. The department of
- 2 treasury shall cause to be paid from the first responder presumed
- 3 coverage fund those amounts and at those times as are prescribed by
- 4 the director to pay claims under subsection (2) pursuant to this
- 5 subsection and subsection (7). Money in the fund at the close of
- 6 the fiscal year shall MUST remain in the fund and shall DOES not
- 7 lapse to the general fund. If there is insufficient money in the
- 8 fund to pay claims authorized under subsection (2), claims that are
- 9 approved but not paid shall MUST be paid if fund revenues become
- 10 available, and those claims shall MUST be paid before subsequently
- 11 approved claims. The director shall develop and implement a process
- 12 to notify the legislature that money in the first responder
- 13 presumed coverage fund may be insufficient to cover future claims
- 14 when the director reasonably believes that within 60 days the money
- 15 in the fund will be insufficient to pay claims. The process shall,
- 16 at a minimum, do all of the following:
- 17 (a) Identify a specific date by which the money in the fund
- 18 will become insufficient to pay claims.
- 19 (b) Outline a clear process indicating the order in which
- 20 claims pending with the fund will be paid.
- 21 (c) Outline a clear process indicating the order in which
- 22 claims that were pending with the fund when money became
- 23 insufficient will be paid, if money subsequently becomes available.
- 24 (7) The director shall develop the application, approval, and
- 25 compliance process necessary to operate and manage the FIRST
- 26 RESPONDER PRESUMED COVERAGE fund. The director shall develop and
- 27 implement the use of an application form to be used by a claimant

- 1 for benefits payable by the fund under subsection (2). When a claim
- 2 under subsection (2) is received, the director shall notify the
- 3 employer against whom a claim is suspended or the carrier. The
- 4 employer or carrier may access all information the agency receives
- 5 respecting the claim and may request that the agency obtain
- 6 specific additional information. The fund standards, guidelines,
- 7 templates, and any other forms used by the director to implement
- 8 the first responder presumed coverage fund shall MUST be posted and
- 9 maintained on the department's website. The director shall review
- 10 and consider claims in the order in which they are received and
- 11 shall approve or deny a claim within 30 days after receipt of the
- 12 claim.
- 13 (8) The director shall submit an annual report to the state
- 14 budget director and the senate and house of representatives
- 15 standing committees on appropriations not later than April 1 of
- 16 each year that includes, but is not limited to, all of the
- 17 following:
- 18 (a) The total number of claims received under the first
- 19 responder presumed coverage fund in the immediately preceding
- 20 calendar year.
- 21 (b) The number of claims approved and the total dollar amount
- 22 of claims paid by the first responder presumed coverage fund in the
- 23 immediately preceding calendar year.
- 24 (c) The costs of administering the first responder presumed
- 25 coverage fund in the immediately preceding calendar year.
- 26 (9) The department shall not implement the first responder
- 27 presumed coverage fund until the legislature has appropriated money

- 1 to the fund.
- 2 (9) (10) By March 31 of each year, the worker's compensation
- 3 agency shall report to the chairs of the appropriations committees
- 4 of the senate and the house of representatives the estimated amount
- 5 of both of the following:
- 6 (a) The anticipated cost of benefits in the next fiscal year
- 7 for claims authorized under subsection (2) and payable by the first
- 8 responder presumed coverage fund.
- 9 (b) The amount of any anticipated shortfall in the first
- 10 responder presumed coverage fund that would prevent payment of
- 11 claims under subsection (6) for the current fiscal year.
- 12 (10) (11)—The first responder presumed coverage fund has the
- 13 same rights under this act as an employer or carrier.
- 14 Enacting section 1. This amendatory act takes effect 90 days
- 15 after the date it is enacted into law.

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
