HOUSE BILL No. 5349

December 12, 2017, Introduced by Rep. Yaroch and referred to the Committee on Local Government.

A bill to amend 1980 PA 243, entitled

"Emergency municipal loan act,"

by amending sections 3 and 7 (MCL 141.933 and 141.937), section 3 as amended by 2016 PA 197 and section 7 as amended by 2015 PA 115.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 3. (1) For state fiscal years ending before October 1,
- 2 2011, the board may authorize loans under this act to
- 3 municipalities that total up to \$5,000,000.00 in a state fiscal
- 4 year. For state fiscal years beginning after September 30, 2018,
- 5 the board may authorize loans under this act to municipalities that
- 6 total up to \$10,000,000.00 in a state fiscal year, but a loan to a
- 7 single municipality shall MUST not exceed \$4,000,000.00 in a state
- fiscal year. For the period beginning on October 1, 2011 and ending

- 1 on September 30, 2018, the board may do all of the following:
- 2 (a) Authorize loans to municipalities other than school
- 3 districts that total up to \$48,000,000.00 during the period. Loans
- 4 to a single municipality under this subdivision shall MUST not
- 5 total more than \$20,000,000.00.
- 6 (b) Except as otherwise provided in this subdivision,
- 7 authorize loans to municipalities that are school districts that
- 8 total up to \$70,000,000.00 during the period. Except as otherwise
- 9 provided in this subdivision, loans to a single school district
- 10 under this subdivision shall MUST not total more than
- 11 \$20,000,000.00. In addition, the board may authorize a loan of up
- 12 to \$150,000,000.00 for transitional operating costs to a school
- 13 district that is or becomes a qualifying school district as
- 14 described in section 12b of the revised school code, 1976 PA 451,
- 15 MCL 380.12b, of which not more than \$25,000,000.00 may be
- 16 authorized and used for deferred facilities maintenance. As used in
- 17 this subdivision, "transitional operating costs" includes, but is
- 18 not limited to, academic and instructional support; professional
- 19 transition costs such as information technology, legal accounting,
- 20 human resources, and financial services; payments to vendors; costs
- 21 relating to changes in timing of grant funding or reimbursements;
- 22 cash flow needs; insurance; academic program expenditures; deferred
- 23 facilities maintenance; space consolidation; and facilities
- 24 rationalization.
- 25 (2) The board may authorize loans under this act to a county
- 26 within the following limitations:
- 27 (a) In the 1998-99 state fiscal year, the board may authorize

- 1 loans under this act to a county with a population greater than
- 2 1,500,000.
- 3 (b) For a state fiscal year in which the block grant
- 4 appropriated to a county with a population of more than 1,500,000
- 5 that is organized under 1966 PA 293, MCL 45.501 to 45.521, and that
- 6 is a county juvenile agency is less than the amount required to be
- 7 distributed to that county in that year under the social welfare
- 8 act, 1939 PA 280, MCL 400.1 to 400.119b, the board may authorize a
- 9 loan to that county in an amount not greater than the difference
- 10 between the amount of the block grant and the amount required to be
- 11 distributed to that county for that fiscal year under the social
- 12 welfare act, 1939 PA 280, MCL 400.1 to 400.119b. The board is not
- 13 required to authorize loans under this subdivision to a county for
- 14 more than 1 state fiscal year.
- 15 (3) If in a state fiscal year the block grant appropriated to
- 16 a county other than a county described in subsection (2) that is a
- 17 county juvenile agency is less than the amount required to be
- 18 distributed to that county in that year under the social welfare
- 19 act, 1939 PA 280, MCL 400.1 to 400.119b, the board may authorize a
- 20 loan to that county in an amount not greater than the difference
- 21 between the amount of the block grant and the amount required to be
- 22 distributed to that county under the social welfare act, 1939 PA
- 23 280, MCL 400.1 to 400.119b, in that state fiscal year.
- 24 (4) Sections 6(2) and 7 and the conditions listed in section
- 25 4(1) do not apply to a loan authorized under subsection (2) or (3).
- **26** (5) The proceeds of a loan made under subsection (2) or (3)
- 27 shall MUST be maintained in a separate account and shall MUST not

- 1 be commingled with the county's general fund or any other special
- 2 fund or account.
- **3** (6) The state treasurer or his or her designee shall monitor
- 4 the expenditure of the proceeds of any loan made under subsection
- **5** (2) or (3).
- **6** (7) The proceeds of a loan made under subsection (2) or (3)
- 7 are subject to the county juvenile agency act, 1998 PA 518, MCL
- **8** 45.621 to 45.631.
- 9 (8) Except as otherwise provided in this subsection, revenue
- 10 for loans made under this act shall MUST be provided from the
- 11 surplus funds of this state under authorization granted under
- 12 section 1 of 1855 PA 105, MCL 21.141, or from the repayment
- 13 proceeds of other loans issued under this act or sold or
- 14 transferred under section 6a. Alternatively, for a school district,
- 15 revenue for a loan made under this act may be provided from money
- 16 advanced to the school district by this state from money
- 17 appropriated from the state school aid fund established under
- 18 section 11 of article IX of the state constitution of 1963 and
- 19 payable to the school district under the state school aid act of
- 20 1979, 1979 PA 94, MCL 388.1601 to 388.1896.
- 21 (9) After September 30, 2012, the board may restructure
- 22 payments, but not the outstanding principal balance or interest, on
- 23 a loan to a municipality under subsection (1) if all of the
- 24 following apply:
- 25 (a) The municipality is in compliance with the terms of the
- 26 loan and any other requirements applicable to the municipality
- 27 under this act.

- 1 (b) The municipality is in compliance with any requirements
- 2 relating to a deficit elimination plan under state law.
- 3 (c) The municipality is in compliance with any applicable
- 4 neutral evaluation process, settlement agreement, consent
- 5 agreement, or order of an emergency manager OR A FINANCIAL
- 6 MANAGEMENT TEAM under the local financial stability and choice act,
- 7 2012 PA 436, MCL 141.1541 to 141.1575, or a successor statute.
- 8 (d) For a municipality that is a school district, the school
- 9 district is in compliance with all requirements for receipt of the
- 10 foundation allowance and any other requirements applicable to the
- 11 school district under the state school aid act of 1979, 1979 PA 94,
- **12** MCL 388.1601 to 388.1896.
- 13 (e) For a municipality other than a school district, the
- 14 municipality is in compliance with statutory revenue sharing or
- 15 other requirements applicable to the municipality under the Glenn
- 16 Steil state revenue sharing act of 1971, 1971 PA 140, MCL 141.901
- **17** to 141.921.
- (f) The restructuring of payments complies with applicable
- **19** law.
- 20 (g) The loan has not been sold or transferred under section
- **21** 6a.
- 22 (10) As used in this section, "county juvenile agency" means
- 23 that term as defined in section 2 of the county juvenile agency
- 24 act, 1998 PA 518, MCL 45.622.
- 25 Sec. 7. (1) A municipality that receives a loan under this act
- 26 shall perform all of the following:
- (a) Except as otherwise provided in this subdivision, employ a

- 1 full-time professional administrator or contract with a person with
- 2 expertise in municipal finance and administration to direct or
- 3 participate directly in the management of the municipality's
- 4 operations until otherwise ordered by the board. If the
- 5 municipality is in receivership under the local financial stability
- 6 and choice act, 2012 PA 436, MCL 141.1541 to 141.1575, or a
- 7 successor statute, the emergency manager OR FINANCIAL MANAGEMENT
- 8 TEAM may perform the functions of the full-time professional
- 9 administrator under this subdivision.
- 10 (b) Not more than 6 months after receiving a loan and
- 11 semiannually after that date for the period the loan is
- 12 outstanding, submit to the board an evaluation of the performance
- 13 of the municipality against the 5-year plan submitted under section
- **14** 4(1).
- 15 (c) Submit all of the following to the board on a quarterly
- 16 basis:
- 17 (i) A statement of actual revenues received in the last
- 18 quarter and in the current fiscal year to date.
- (ii) A statement of total revenues estimated to be received by
- 20 the municipality in the current fiscal year.
- 21 (iii) A statement of expenditures made and encumbrances
- 22 entered into by the municipality in the last quarter and in the
- 23 current fiscal year to date.
- (iv) A statement of revenues that were estimated to be
- 25 received and expenditures that were estimated to be made during the
- 26 current fiscal year and through the end of the last quarter.
- **27** (v) A balance sheet indicating whether total estimated

- 1 expenditures for the current fiscal year and for the last quarter
- 2 exceed the total estimated revenues for the current fiscal year and
- 3 for the last quarter, respectively.
- 4 (d) Submit the general appropriations act of the municipality,
- 5 and any amendments to that act, adopted under the uniform budgeting
- 6 and accounting act, 1968 PA 2, MCL 141.421 to 141.440a, or any
- 7 equivalent report as may be required by the board if the
- 8 municipality is not required to adopt a general appropriations act.
- 9 (e) Submit any budget change in the current fiscal year or any
- 10 amendment to the general appropriations act of the municipality for
- 11 the current fiscal year to the board before adoption.
- 12 (f) Submit any budget for the ensuing fiscal year or the
- 13 general appropriations act of the municipality for the ensuing
- 14 fiscal year to the board before adoption.
- 15 (g) Certify that the municipality has fully complied with all
- 16 statutory requirements concerning use of the uniform chart of
- 17 accounts and audits.
- 18 (2) If the state treasurer determines that a municipality is
- 19 not in compliance with all of the requirements under subsection (1)
- 20 and with the 5-year plan submitted under section 4(1), the state
- 21 treasurer may modify the terms of the loan to require a higher
- 22 interest rate or to accelerate the repayment of the loan.
- 23 (3) As used in this section, "expenditure" and "revenue" mean
- 24 those terms as defined in sections 2c and 2d of the uniform
- 25 budgeting and accounting act, 1968 PA 2, MCL 141.422c and 141.422d.
- 26 (4) Subsection (1) does not apply to a loan authorized under
- 27 section 3(2) or (3).
