Senator Wojno, Alexander, Ananich, Barrett, Bayer, Brinks, Bullock, Chang, Daley, Hertel, Johnson, Lucido, McCann, McMorrow, Moss, Polehanki, Santana, VanderWall and Zorn offered the following resolution:

- 1 A resolution recognizing May 5-11, 2019, as InfantSEE® Week.
- 2 Whereas, The most critical stages of vision development occur
- 3 in the first year of a child's life when the eye undergoes rapid
- 4 and profound changes; and
- 5 Whereas, It is recommended infants should receive a
- 6 comprehensive baseline eye exam between the ages of six to twelve
- 7 months because undetected eye and vision problems can lead to
- 8 permanent vision impairment or loss of life; and
- 9 Whereas, One-in-ten children are at-risk from undiagnosed eye

- 1 and vision problems. By the time children enter school, nearly 25
- 2 percent will need or wear corrective lenses; and
- 3 Whereas, One-in-thirty children will be affected by amblyopia-
- 4 a leading cause of vision loss in people younger than forty-five
- 5 years; and
- 6 Whereas, Undetected vision problems can contribute to a
- 7 decrease in a child's quality of life and may lead to developmental
- 8 and behavioral difficulties which impede classroom learning, as
- 9 well as increase the costs to society; and
- 10 Whereas, Early detection of vision problems is the best way to
- 11 treat and prevent permanent vision impairment; and
- 12 Whereas, Member Optometrists of the American Optometric
- 13 Association and The Vision Care Institute® of Johnson & Johnson,
- 14 Inc. have partnered to create InfantSEE®, a public health program
- 15 to provide a one-time, no cost, eye assessment for infants six to
- 16 twelve months; and
- Whereas, InfantSEE® is a program that is comprised of nearly
- 18 4,000 optometrists volunteering their services across the country.
- 19 InfantSEE® has provided over 140,000 infants with comprehensive eye
- 20 assessments since the start of the program in 2005; now therefore,

- 22 Resolved by the Senate, That the members of this legislative
- 23 body recognize the week of May 5-11, 2019, as InfantSEE® Week; and
- 24 be it further
- 25 Resolved, We commend the members of the Michigan Optometric
- 26 Association and the profession of optometry on the eleventh
- 27 anniversary of the InfantSEE® program for voluntarily dedicating
- 28 their expertise and services to the infants of Michigan; and be it
