Reps. Smit, Fox, DeSana and Friske introduced

House Bill No. 4762, entitled

A bill to amend 1954 PA 116, entitled "Michigan election law," by amending sections 662 and 668b (MCL 168.662 and 168.668b), section 662 as amended by 2022 PA 219 and section 668b as added by 2018 PA 614, and by adding sections 720a, 720b, 720c, 720d, 720e, 720f, 720g, 720h, 720i, and 720j.

The bill was read a first time by its title and referred to the Committee on Elections.
