Introduction and Referral of Bills

Senators Hertel, Polehanki, Bayer, McCann, Wojno, Santana, Chang, Geiss and McBroom introduced **Senate Bill No. 834, entitled**

A bill to amend 2004 PA 46, entitled "Public safety officers benefit act," by amending section 4 (MCL 28.634).

The bill was read a first and second time by title and referred to the Committee on Veterans and Emergency Services.

Senator Geiss entered the Senate Chamber.

Senators Chang, Moss, Bayer, Santana, Geiss, Shink and Cavanagh introduced **Senate Bill No. 835, entitled**

A bill to amend 1953 PA 232, entitled "Corrections code of 1953," by amending sections 34c and 35 (MCL 791.234c and 791.235), section 34c as added by 2012 PA 24 and section 35 as amended by 2019 PA 13.

The bill was read a first and second time by title and referred to the Committee on Elections and Ethics.

Senators McDonald Rivet, Singh, McMorrow, Polehanki, Chang, Hertel and McCann introduced **Senate Bill No. 836, entitled**

A bill to require the adjustment of reimbursements made to child care providers under the child development and care program for inflation; and to provide for the powers and duties of certain state and local governmental officers and entities.

The bill was read a first and second time by title and referred to the Committee on Housing and Human Services.

Senators Hertel, McDonald Rivet, McMorrow, Singh, Polehanki, Chang and McCann introduced **Senate Bill No. 837, entitled**

A bill to amend 1973 PA 116, entitled “An act to provide for the protection of children through the licensing and regulation of child care organizations; to provide for the establishment of standards of care for child care organizations; to prescribe powers and duties of certain departments of this state and adoption facilitators; to provide penalties; and to repeal acts and parts of acts,” (MCL 722.111 to 722.128) by adding section 12a.

The bill was read a first and second time by title and referred to the Committee on Housing and Human Services.
