

HOUSE BILL NO. 4263

March 14, 2023, Introduced by Reps. Kuhn, Thompson, Greene, Rigas, Kunse, Bierlein, Bollin, Meerman, Tisdell, Schuette, Bezotte, Borton, Steele, St. Germaine and Beson and referred to the Committee on Ethics and Oversight.

A bill to amend 1986 PA 268, entitled
"Legislative council act,"
by amending section 104a (MCL 4.1104a), as amended by 2013 PA 241.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

1 Sec. 104a. (1) The council shall appoint a council
2 administrator who ~~shall be~~**is** the chief executive officer of all
3 legislative council agencies. The council administrator is an at-
4 will employee and ~~shall serve~~**serves** at the pleasure of the
5 council. The council administrator has all the following duties and

1 responsibilities:

2 (a) To provide general supervisory oversight over all
3 legislative council agencies.

4 (b) To provide personnel policy oversight and development for
5 all legislative council agencies.

6 (c) To develop, prepare, and present legislative council
7 agency budgets.

8 (d) To review quarterly financial statements of legislative
9 council agencies and monitor budgetary compliance.

10 (e) To act as secretary to the council, including, but not
11 limited to, the following:

12 (i) Scheduling of meetings for the council and subcommittees.

13 (ii) Keeping and recording of minutes and records of meetings.

14 (f) To perform other duties and responsibilities as determined
15 and assigned by the council.

16 **(g) To receive and decide appeals of public record requests,**
17 **as provided in the legislative open records act, 1976 PA 442, MCL**
18 **15.251 to 15.259f.**

19 (2) In addition to the responsibilities provided in subsection
20 (1), at the direction of the Michigan state capitol commission, the
21 council administrator shall do both of the following:

22 (a) Administer compensation, benefits, and other personnel
23 support for the employees of the Michigan state capitol commission.

24 (b) Administer computer, telephone, and technical support for
25 employees of the Michigan state capitol commission.

26 Enacting section 1. This amendatory act takes effect January
27 1, 2024.

28 Enacting section 2. This amendatory act does not take effect
29 unless all of the following bills of the 102nd Legislature are
