

HOUSE BILL NO. 5116

October 23, 2025, Introduced by Rep. Mueller and referred to Committee on Regulatory Reform.

A bill to amend 1972 PA 382, entitled
"Traxler-McCauley-Law-Bowman bingo act,"
by amending section 41 (MCL 432.141), as added by 2019 PA 159.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

1 Sec. 41. (1) A millionaire party licensee shall ensure that an
2 event conducted under the license is conducted in compliance with
3 this act and the rules promulgated under this act.

4 (2) A millionaire party licensee shall post the license so
5 that it is conspicuously visible at the location where the event is
6 being conducted at all times during the event.

7 (3) A millionaire party licensee shall not conduct gaming

1 under the license anywhere outside of the demarcated area approved
2 by the executive director.

3 (4) A millionaire party licensee shall ensure that access to
4 the demarcated area is controlled.

5 (5) A millionaire party licensee shall not allow an individual
6 who is less than 18 years ~~old-of age~~ to enter the demarcated area
7 when gaming is being conducted there.

8 (6) If alcoholic beverages are served at an event, an
9 individual in the demarcated area who is 18 years ~~old-of age~~ or
10 older but less than 21 years ~~old-of age~~ must be identified by
11 wearing a mark indicating that a member or agent of the millionaire
12 party licensee has verified the individual's age and
13 identification.

14 (7) A millionaire party licensee shall not receive more than
15 ~~\$20,000.00~~ **\$40,000.00** in exchange for imitation money or chips on
16 any day under the license. However, if the licensee conducts the
17 millionaire party without using dealers from a supplier and owns
18 the location at which the millionaire party is held and if the
19 license is for fewer than 4 days of gaming, the daily limit under
20 this subsection is determined by dividing ~~\$80,000.00~~ **\$160,000.00** by
21 the number of days of gaming allowed under the license.

22 (8) A millionaire party licensee may conduct a charity game as
23 provided in section 7b and may conduct a numeral game as provided
24 in section 7c. If a millionaire party licensee conducts a charity
25 game or a numeral game, the executive director has sole enforcement
26 and supervision authority over the conduct of the game.
