## **HOUSE BILL NO. 5125**

October 23, 2025, Introduced by Reps. Harris, Frisbie, Rigas, Outman, Wozniak, Greene, Linting and Kunse and referred to Committee on Judiciary.

A bill to amend 1931 PA 328, entitled "The Michigan penal code,"

(MCL 750.1 to 750.568) by adding section 356e.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- Sec. 356e. (1) An individual who commits a violation of this chapter in which the property stolen is cargo may be subject to an enhanced sentence of an additional term of imprisonment of not more
- 4 than 10 years.
- 5 (2) If the prosecuting attorney intends to seek the enhanced 6 sentence under subsection (1), the prosecuting attorney shall

- 1 include on the complaint and information a statement that the
- 2 defendant is subject to the enhanced sentence.
- 3 (3) A term of imprisonment imposed under subsection (1) must
- 4 run consecutively to any term of imprisonment imposed for another
- 5 violation arising from the same transaction.
- 6 (4) As used in this section:
- 7 (a) "Cargo", except as otherwise provided in this subdivision,
- 8 means goods, chattels, money, or baggage that constitutes, in whole
- 9 or in part, a commercial shipment of freight moving in commerce,
- 10 from any pipeline system, railroad car, truck, or other vehicle, or
- 11 from any tank or storage facility, station house, platform, or
- 12 depot, or from any vessel or wharf, or from any aircraft, air
- 13 terminal, airport, aircraft terminal, or air navigation facility,
- 14 or from any intermodal container, intermodal chassis, trailer,
- 15 container freight station, warehouse, freight distribution
- 16 facility, or freight consolidation facility. Cargo does not include
- 17 direct-to-consumer goods.
- 18 (b) "Moving in commerce" means all points from the point of
- 19 origin to the final destination, regardless of any temporary stop
- 20 while awaiting transshipment or otherwise.
- 21 Enacting section 1. This amendatory act takes effect 90 days
- 22 after the date it is enacted into law.
