

# HOUSE BILL NO. 5264

November 12, 2025, Introduced by Reps. Xiong, Rogers, Neeley, Brixie, Dievendorf, Young, B. Carter, Price, Morgan, McKinney, Witwer, Tate, Liberati, Weiss, Tsernoglou, Steckloff, Paiz, Scott, Mentzer, O'Neal, Byrnes, Glanville, Longjohn, T. Carter, Andrews, Miller, McFall, Koleszar, Wooden and Breen and referred to Committee on Government Operations.

A bill to create a Michigan military and veteran services support fund; to create a Michigan military and veteran services support fund board and prescribe its powers and duties; and to provide for the powers and duties of certain state governmental officers and entities.

**THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:**

- 1           Sec. 1. As used in this act:
- 2           (a) "Board" means the Michigan military and veteran services
- 3 support fund board created in section 5.
- 4           (b) "Services support fund" means the Michigan military and

1 veteran services support fund created in section 3.

2       Sec. 3. (1) The Michigan military and veteran services support  
3 fund is created as a charitable and educational endowment fund in  
4 the department of treasury. Contributions made to the services  
5 support fund are considered tax-deductible donations. Money in the  
6 services support fund at the end of the fiscal year remains in the  
7 services support fund and does not lapse to the general fund.

8       (2) The services support fund must have separate accounts for  
9 each of the following:

10       (a) Supporting and enhancing this state's military service  
11 members, their families, and the economy.

12       (b) Supporting and enhancing this state's veterans, their  
13 families, and the communities where they live.

14       (3) The state treasurer shall direct the investment of the  
15 services support fund. The state treasurer has the same authority  
16 to invest the assets of the services support fund as an investment  
17 fiduciary under the public employee retirement system investment  
18 act, 1965 PA 314, MCL 38.1132 to 38.1141. The state treasurer shall  
19 comply with the divestment from terror act, 2008 PA 234, MCL  
20 129.291 to 129.301, when investing the assets of the services  
21 support fund.

22       (4) Money granted or received as a gift or donation to the  
23 services support fund is available for disbursement on  
24 appropriation.

25       (5) The state treasurer shall annually prepare an accounting  
26 of revenues and expenditures from the services support fund. The  
27 accounting must be provided to the senate and house of  
28 representatives appropriations committees. The accounting must do  
29 all of the following:

1 (a) Specifically identify the interest and earnings of the  
2 services support fund.

3 (b) Describe how the amount of interest and earnings has been  
4 affected by the expanded investment options provided for in  
5 subsection (3).

6 (c) Identify how the increased interest and earnings, if any,  
7 have been expended.

8 Sec. 5. (1) The Michigan military and veteran services support  
9 fund board is established to provide oversight and management of  
10 the services support fund created in section 3.

11 (2) The board consists of 7 members as follows:

12 (a) The director of the department of military and veterans  
13 affairs, or the director's designee.

14 (b) The director of the Michigan veterans affairs agency, or  
15 the director's designee.

16 (c) Five members, who have a background or experience in  
17 fundraising or charitable giving, appointed by the governor as  
18 follows:

19 (i) One member who represents the interests of service members  
20 and their families.

21 (ii) One member who represents the interests of veterans, their  
22 families, and the communities where they live.

23 (iii) Subject to subdivision (d), 1 member who represents the  
24 interests of a congressionally chartered veteran service  
25 organization.

26 (iv) One member who represents the interests of a military  
27 trade association or support entity.

28 (v) One member who represents the interests of the general  
29 public.

1 (d) After the initial appointment under subdivision (c) (iii) is  
2 made, each member appointed under subdivision (c) (iii) must represent  
3 a different congressionally chartered veteran organization than the  
4 member previously appointed under subdivision (c) (iii).

5 (3) The appointed members of the board as described in  
6 subsection (2)(c) shall serve for terms of 4 years. Of the 5  
7 members first appointed to the board, 2 must be appointed for an  
8 initial term of 1 year, 2 must be appointed for an initial term of  
9 2 years, and 1 must be appointed for an initial term of 3 years.  
10 The appointed members of the board shall serve until a successor is  
11 appointed. A vacancy must be filled for the balance of the  
12 unexpired term in the same manner as the original appointment.

13 (4) The members of the board are subject to 1968 PA 317, MCL  
14 15.321 to 15.330, and 1968 PA 318, MCL 15.301 to 15.310.

15 (5) The board shall organize and make its own policies and  
16 procedures. The board shall conduct its business in compliance with  
17 the open meetings act, 1976 PA 267, MCL 15.261 to 15.275.

18 (6) The department of military and veterans affairs shall  
19 provide the board with administrative and staff support and other  
20 services.

21 Sec. 7. The board may do all of the following:

22 (a) Oversee the services support fund, request appropriations,  
23 and make allocations of revenue from the services support fund to  
24 provide both of the following:

25 (i) Direct grants to an individual or entity for the purposes  
26 described in section 3(2).

27 (ii) Supplemental funding to the department of military and  
28 veterans affairs for the department's services and programs.

29 (b) Accept, hold, and administer gifts and bequests of money,

1 securities, or other property, absolutely or in trust, to carry out  
2 the services support fund's purposes.

3 (c) Enter into contracts and execute all instruments necessary  
4 and appropriate to carry out the services support fund's purposes.

5 (d) Take reasonably necessary actions to seek, promote, and  
6 stimulate contributions for the services support fund.

7 (e) Perform any lawful acts necessary or appropriate to carry  
8 out the services support fund's purposes.

9 (f) Develop policies and procedures applicable to the  
10 management and functioning of the services support fund.
