## **SENATE BILL NO. 617**

October 22, 2025, Introduced by Senators GEISS, ANTHONY, SHINK and CAVANAGH and referred to Committee on Transportation and Infrastructure.

A bill to amend 1972 PA 222, entitled

"An act to provide for an official personal identification card; to provide for its form, issuance and use; to regulate the use and disclosure of information obtained from the card; to prescribe the powers and duties of the secretary of state; to prescribe fees; to prescribe certain penalties for violations; and to provide an appropriation for certain purposes,"

by amending section 2 (MCL 28.292), as amended by 2021 PA 73.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 2. (1) An official state personal identification card
- 2 must contain the following:
- 3 (a) An identification number permanently assigned to the

- 1 individual to whom the card is issued.
- 2 (b) Except as provided in section 2a, the full legal name,
- 3 date of birth, sex, residence address, height, weight, eye color,
- 4 digital photographic image, signature of or verification and
- 5 certification by the applicant, as determined by the secretary of
- 6 state, and expiration date of the official state personal
- 7 identification card. If an official state personal identification
- 8 card is issued to an individual described in section 1(5) who has
- 9 temporary lawful status, the official state personal identification
- 10 card must be issued in compliance with 6 CFR 37.21 or in compliance
- 11 with the process established to comply with 6 CFR 37.71 by the
- 12 secretary of state. As used in this subdivision, "temporary lawful
- 13 status" means that term as defined in 6 CFR 37.3.
- 14 (c) An indication that the identification card contains 1 or
- 15 more of the following:
- 16 (i) The blood type of the individual.
- 17 (ii) Immunization data of the individual.
- 18 (iii) Medication data of the individual.
- 19 (iv) A statement that the individual is deaf.
- 20 (d) In Except as otherwise provided in this subdivision, in
- 21 the case of a holder of an official state personal identification
- 22 card who has indicated his or her the holder's wish to participate
- 23 in the anatomical gift donor registry under part 101 of the public
- 24 health code, 1978 PA 368, MCL 333.10101 to 333.10123, a heart
- 25 insignia on the front of the physical official state personal
- 26 identification card. A mobile official state personal
- 27 identification card issued under subsection (26) may contain a
- 28 heart insignia, code, text-based indicator, or other indicator
- 29 approved by the secretary of state to indicate that the holder of

- an official state personal identification card wishes to

  participate in the anatomical gift donor registry under part 101 of

  the public health code, 1978 PA 368, MCL 333.10101 to 333.10123.
- 4 (e) If requested by an individual who is a veteran as that term is defined in section 1 of 1965 PA 190, MCL 35.61, a 5 6 designation that the individual is a veteran. The designation must 7 be in a style and format considered appropriate by the secretary of 8 state. The secretary of state shall require proof of discharge or 9 separation of service from the armed forces of this state, another 10 state, or the United States, and the nature of that discharge, for 11 the purposes of verifying an individual's status as a veteran under 12 this subdivision. The secretary of state shall consult with the department of military and veterans affairs in determining the 13 14 proof that must be required to identify an individual's status as a 15 veteran for the purposes of this subsection. The secretary of state 16 may provide the department of military and veterans affairs and 17 agencies of the counties of this state that provide veteran 18 services with information provided by an applicant under this 19 subsection for the purpose of veterans' benefits eligibility 20 referral.
  - (f) Physical security Security features designed to prevent tampering, counterfeiting, or duplication of the official state personal identification card for fraudulent purposes.
- (2) In conjunction with the application for an official state
  personal identification card, the secretary of state shall do all
  of the following:
  - (a) Provide the applicant with all of the following:
- (i) Information explaining the applicant's right to make ananatomical gift in the event of death under part 101 of the public

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- health code, 1978 PA 368, MCL 333.10101 to 333.10123, and in
  accordance with this section.
- $oldsymbol{3}$  (ii) Information describing the donor registry program
- 4 maintained by Michigan's federally designated organ procurement
- 5 organization or its successor organization under section 10120 of
- 6 the public health code, 1978 PA 368, MCL 333.10120. The information
- 7 required under this subparagraph must include the address and
- 8 telephone number of Michigan's federally designated organ
- 9 procurement organization or its successor organization as described
- 10 in section 10120 of the public health code, 1978 PA 368, MCL
- **11** 333.10120.
- 12 (iii) Information giving the applicant the opportunity to have
- 13 his or her the applicant's name placed on the registry described in
- **14** subparagraph (ii).
- 15 (b) Provide the applicant with the opportunity to specify on
- 16 his or her the applicant's official state personal identification
- 17 card that he or she the applicant is willing to make an anatomical
- 18 gift in the event of death under part 101 of the public health
- 19 code, 1978 PA 368, MCL 333.10101 to 333.10123, and in accordance
- 20 with this section.
- 21 (c) Inform the applicant that, if he or she the applicant
- 22 indicates to the secretary of state under this section a
- 23 willingness to have his or her the applicant's name placed on the
- 24 donor registry described in subdivision (a) (ii), the secretary of
- 25 state will mark the applicant's record for the donor registry.
- 26 (3) The secretary of state may fulfill the requirements of
- 27 subsection (2) by 1 or more of the following methods:
- 28 (a) Providing printed material enclosed with a mailed notice
- 29 for the issuance or renewal of an official state personal

- 1 identification card.
- 2 (b) Providing printed material to an applicant who personally3 appears at a secretary of state branch office.
- 4 (c) Through electronic information transmittals for5 applications processed by electronic means.
- 6 (4) The secretary of state shall prescribe the form of the7 official state personal identification card. The secretary of state
- 8 shall designate a space on the official state personal
- 9 identification card where the applicant may place a sticker or
- 10 decal of a uniform size as the secretary may specify to indicate
- 11 that the cardholder carries a separate emergency medical
- 12 information card. The sticker or decal may be provided by any
- 13 person, hospital, school, medical group, or association interested
- 14 in assisting in implementing the emergency medical information
- 15 card, but must meet the specifications of the secretary of state.
- 16 The sticker or decal also may be used to indicate that the
- 17 cardholder has designated 1 or more patient advocates in accordance
- 18 with section 5506 of the estates and protected individuals code,
- 19 1998 PA 386, MCL 700.5506. The emergency medical information card,
- 20 carried separately by the cardholder, may contain the information
- 21 described in subsection (2)(c), information concerning the
- 22 cardholder's patient advocate designation, other emergency medical
- 23 information, or an indication as to where the cardholder has stored
- 24 or registered emergency medical information. An Except for a mobile
- 25 official state personal identification card issued or renewed under
- 26 subsection (26), an original official state personal identification
- 27 card or the renewal of an existing official state personal
- 28 identification card issued to an individual who is less than 21
- 29 years of age must be portrait or vertical in form, and an official

- 1 state personal identification card issued to an individual who is
- 2 21 years of age or over older must be landscape or horizontal in
- 3 form. Except as otherwise required in this act, other information
- 4 required on the official state personal identification card under
- 5 this act may appear on the official state personal identification
- 6 card in a form prescribed by the secretary of state.
- 7 (5) The official state personal identification card must not
- 8 contain a fingerprint or finger image of the applicant.
- **9** (6) Except as provided in this subsection, the secretary of
- 10 state shall retain and use an individual's digital photographic
- 11 image and signature described in subsection (1)(b) only for
- 12 programs administered by the secretary of state as specifically
- 13 authorized by law. An individual's digital photographic image or
- 14 signature must only be used as follows:
- 15 (a) By a federal, state, or local governmental agency for a
- 16 law enforcement purpose authorized by law.
- 17 (b) By the secretary of state for a use specifically
- 18 authorized by law.
- 19 (c) By the secretary of state for forwarding to the department
- 20 of state police the images of individuals required to be registered
- 21 under the sex offenders registration act, 1994 PA 295, MCL 28.721
- 22 to 28.730, upon on the department of state police providing the
- 23 secretary of state an updated list of those individuals.
- 24 (d) By the secretary of state for forwarding to the department
- 25 of state police a digitized photograph taken of the applicant for
- 26 an official state personal identification card for use as provided
- 27 in section 5c of 1927 PA 372, MCL 28.425c.
- 28 (e) By the secretary of state for forwarding to the department
- 29 of licensing and regulatory affairs the images of applicants for an

- 1 official state registry identification card issued under section 6
- 2 of the Michigan Medical Marihuana Act, 2008 IL 1, MCL 333.26426, if
- 3 the department of licensing and regulatory affairs promulgates
- 4 rules requiring a photograph as a design element for an official
- 5 state registry identification card.
- 6 (f) As necessary to comply with a law of this state or the7 United States.
- 8 (7) If Except as otherwise provided in this subsection, if an
- 9 individual presents evidence of statutory blindness as provided in
- 10 1978 PA 260, MCL 393.351 to 393.368, and is issued or is the holder
- 11 of an official state personal identification card, the secretary of
- 12 state shall mark the individual's physical official state personal
- 13 identification card in a manner that clearly indicates that the
- 14 cardholder is legally blind. A mobile official state personal
- 15 identification card issued under subsection (26) may contain a
- 16 text-based indicator, code, or other indicator approved by the
- 17 secretary of state to indicate that the holder of an official state
- 18 personal identification card is legally blind.
- 19 (8) The secretary of state shall maintain a record of an
- 20 individual who indicates a willingness to have his or her the
- 21 individual's name placed on the donor registry described in
- 22 subsection (2)(a)(ii). Information about an individual's indication
- 23 of a willingness to have his or her the individual's name placed on
- 24 the donor registry that is obtained by the secretary of state and
- 25 forwarded under this section is exempt from disclosure under
- 26 section 13(1)(d) of the freedom of information act, 1976 PA 442,
- 27 MCL 15.243. As required in section 10120 of the public health code,
- 28 1978 PA 368, MCL 333.10120, the secretary of state shall establish
- 29 and maintain the donor registry in a manner that complies with that

- 1 section and that provides electronic access, including, but not
- 2 limited to, the transfer of data to this state's federally
- 3 designated organ procurement organization or its successor
- 4 organization, tissue banks, and eye banks.
- **5** (9) An official state personal identification card may contain
- 6 an identifier for voter registration purposes.
- 7 (10) An official state personal identification card must
- 8 contain information appearing in electronic or machine-readable
- 9 codes needed to conduct a transaction with the secretary of state.
- 10 The information must be limited to the information described in
- 11 subsection (1)(a) and (b) except for the individual's digital
- 12 photographic image and signature or verification and certification,
- 13 state of issuance, and other information necessary for use with
- 14 electronic devices, machine readers, or automatic teller machines
- 15 and must not contain the individual's driving record or other
- 16 personal identifier. The official state personal identification
- 17 card must identify the encoded information.
- 18 (11) An official state personal identification card must be
- 19 issued only upon on authorization of the secretary of state, and
- 20 must be manufactured in a manner to prohibit as nearly as possible
- 21 the ability to reproduce, alter, counterfeit, forge, or duplicate
- 22 the official state personal identification card without ready
- 23 detection.
- 24 (12) Except as otherwise provided in this act, an applicant
- 25 shall pay a fee of \$10.00 to the secretary of state for each
- 26 original or renewal official state personal identification card
- 27 issued. The secretary of state shall not assess a late renewal fee
- 28 for an official state personal identification card that expires on
- 29 or after March 1, 2020 and is renewed before March 31, 2021. The

- secretary of state shall not assess a late renewal fee for an 1 official state personal identification card that expires after 2 March 31, 2021 but before August 1, 2021 and is renewed within 120 3 days after the date of the expiration. The secretary of state 4 5 shall, upon an applicant's request, reimburse a late renewal fee 6 assessed and collected for an official state personal 7 identification card that expires after March 31, 2021 but before 8 August 1, 2021 and is renewed within 120 days after the date of the 9 expiration of the official state personal identification card. The 10 department of treasury shall deposit the fees received and collected under this section in the state treasury to the credit of 11 12 the general fund. The legislature shall appropriate the fees credited to the general fund under this act to the secretary of 13 14 state for the administration of this act. Appropriations from the 15 Michigan transportation fund created under section 10 of 1951 PA 16 51, MCL 247.660, must not be used to compensate the secretary of 17 state for costs incurred and services performed under this section. 18 (13) An original or renewal official state personal 19 identification card or a mobile official state personal 20 identification card or renewal mobile official state personal 21 identification card expires on the birthday of the individual to 22 whom it is issued in the fourth year following the date of issuance 23 or on the date the individual is no longer considered to be legally present in the United States under section 1, whichever is earlier. 24
- 26 identification card or a mobile official state personal
- 27 identification card under this act for a period greater than 4
- 28 years. Except as provided in this subsection, the secretary of
- 29 state may issue a renewal official state personal identification

The secretary of state shall not issue an official state personal

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- 1 card or renewal mobile official state personal identification card
- 2 for 1 additional 4-year period or beginning on July 1, 2021, for 2
- 3 additional 4-year periods, by mail or by other methods prescribed
- 4 by the secretary of state. The secretary of state shall require
- 5 renewal in person by an individual required under section 5a of the
- 6 sex offenders registration act, 1994 PA 295, MCL 28.725a, to
- 7 maintain a valid operator's or chauffeur's license or official
- 8 state personal identification card.
- 9 (14) The secretary of state shall waive the fee required under
- 10 this section subsections (12) and (24) if the applicant is any of
- 11 the following:
- 12 (a) An individual 65 years of age or older.
- 13 (b) An individual who has had his or her the individual's
- 14 operator's or chauffeur's license suspended, revoked, or denied
- 15 under the Michigan vehicle code, 1949 PA 300, MCL 257.1 to 257.923,
- 16 because of a mental or physical infirmity or disability.
- 17 (c) An individual who presents evidence of statutory blindness
- 18 as provided in 1978 PA 260, MCL 393.351 to 393.368.
- 19 (d) An individual who presents evidence of 1 or more of the
- 20 following:
- 21 (i) A notice of case action from the department of health and
- 22 human services indicating that the individual is a participant in 1
- 23 or both of the following programs and is making his or her the
- 24 individual's application for an official state personal
- 25 identification card during a period in which he or she the
- 26 individual is receiving benefits:
- 27 (A) The family independence program.
- (B) The state disability assistance program.
- 29 (ii) A United States Social Security Administration benefit

- 1 award letter indicating the applicant is currently receiving
- 2 payments under the federal supplemental security income program as
- 3 that term is defined in section 57 of the social welfare act, 1939
- 4 PA 280, MCL 400.57, or the Social Security disability income
- 5 program.
- 6 (iii) A United States Social Security Administration benefit
- 7 verification letter indicating the applicant is currently receiving
- 8 payments under the federal supplemental security income program as
- 9 that term is defined in section 57 of the social welfare act, 1939
- 10 PA 280, MCL 400.57, or the Social Security disability income
- 11 program.
- 12 (e) An individual who decides to add or remove a heart
- 13 insignia described in subsection (1)(d).
- 14 (f) An individual who is a veteran as that term is defined in
- 15 section 1 of 1965 PA 190, MCL 35.61. The secretary of state shall
- 16 require an individual who seeks a waiver of the fee under this
- 17 subdivision to provide the secretary of state the same
- 18 documentation required for a veteran designation under subsection
- 19 (1) (e) before granting the fee waiver.
- 20 (g) An individual who presents both of the following:
- 21 (i) A homeless verification letter that states that the
- 22 individual meets the definition of category 1 homeless as that term
- 23 is defined by the United States Department of Housing and Urban
- 24 Development. A letter provided as evidence under this subparagraph
- 25 must be submitted on the official letterhead of a public service
- 26 agency. The secretary of state may verify the information contained
- 27 in the letter with the agency of issuance before issuing an
- 28 official state personal identification card.
- 29 (ii) A photo identification card generated from the United

- 1 States Department of Housing and Urban Development Homeless
- 2 Management Information System.
- 3 (15) An individual who has been issued an official state
- 4 personal identification card shall apply for a renewal official
- 5 state personal identification card if the individual changes his or
- 6 her the individual's name.
- 7 (16) An individual who has been issued an official state
- 8 personal identification card shall apply for a corrected
- 9 identification card if he or she the individual changes his or her
- 10 the individual's residence address. The secretary of state may
- 11 correct the address on an official state personal identification
- 12 card by a method prescribed by the secretary of state. A fee must
- 13 not be charged for a change of residence address.
- 14 (17) An individual who has been issued an official state
- 15 personal identification card or mobile official state personal
- 16 identification card may apply for a renewal official state personal
- 17 identification card or renewal mobile official state personal
- 18 identification card for 1 or more of the following reasons:
- 19 (a) The individual wants to change any information on the
- 20 official state personal identification card.
- 21 (b) An official state personal identification card issued
- 22 under this act is lost, destroyed, or mutilated, or becomes
- 23 illegible.
- 24 (18) An individual may indicate on an official state personal
- 25 identification card in a place designated by the secretary of state
- 26 his or her the individual's blood type, emergency contact
- 27 information, immunization data, medication data, or a statement
- 28 that the individual is deaf. A mobile official state personal
- 29 identification card may contain a text-based indicator, code, or

- other indicator approved by the secretary of state to indicate that the holder of an official state personal identification card is deaf.
- 4 (19) The secretary of state shall develop and shall, in
  5 conjunction with the department of state police, implement a
  6 process using the L.E.I.N. or any other appropriate system that
  7 limits access to law enforcement that allows law enforcement
  8 agencies of this state to access emergency contact information and,
  9 beginning July 1, 2021, to view a communication impediment
  10 designation that the holder of an official state personal
- identification card has voluntarily provided to the secretary of
  state.
- 13 (20) If an applicant provides proof to the secretary of state
  14 that he or she the applicant is a minor who has been emancipated
  15 under 1968 PA 293, MCL 722.1 to 722.6, the official state personal
  16 identification card must bear the designation of the individual's
  17 emancipated status in a manner prescribed by the secretary of
  18 state.
- 19 (21) The secretary of state shall inquire of each individual 20 who applies for or who holds an official state personal 21 identification card, in person or by mail, whether he or she the individual agrees to participate in the anatomical gift donor 22 23 registry under part 101 of the public health code, 1978 PA 368, MCL 24 333.10101 to 333.10123. An individual who has agreed to participate 25 in the donor registry is not considered to have revoked that agreement solely because the individual's official state personal 26 27 identification card has expired. Enrollment in the donor registry 28 is a legal agreement that remains binding and in effect after the

donor's death regardless of the expressed desires of the deceased

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- 1 donor's next of kin who may oppose the donor's anatomical gift.
- 2 (22) A valid official state personal identification card
- 3 presented by the individual to whom the card is issued is
- 4 considered the same as a valid state of Michigan driver license
- 5 when identification is requested except as otherwise specifically
- 6 provided by law.
- 7 (23) Beginning July 1, 2021, if an official state personal
- 8 identification card issued under this act is lost, destroyed, or
- 9 mutilated, or becomes illegible, the individual to whom the
- 10 official state personal identification card was issued may obtain a
- 11 duplicate upon on the payment of the fee required in subsection
- 12 (24) and <del>upon on</del> furnishing proof satisfactory to the secretary of
- 13 state that the official state personal identification card has been
- 14 lost, destroyed, or mutilated, or has become illegible.
- 15 (24) Except as otherwise provided in subsection (25), for each
- 16 duplicate official state personal identification card, and for each
- 17 correction of an official state personal identification card,
- 18 beginning July 1, 2021, an individual may apply for renewal of the
- 19 official state personal identification card and pay the renewal fee
- 20 prescribed in this act or the individual may, at his or her the
- 21 individual's option and upon on payment of the fee prescribed in
- 22 this section, apply for a duplicate official state personal
- 23 identification card that expires on the same date as the official
- 24 state personal identification card that was lost, destroyed, or
- 25 mutilated, or became illegible. The fee for a duplicate official
- 26 state personal identification card is \$10.00. A renewal fee must
- 27 not be charged for a change of address, a correction required to
- 28 correct a department error, or to add or remove a heart insignia
- 29 described in subsection (1)(d).

(25) Except with regard to an individual who is less than 21 1 2 years of age, for each duplicate official state personal identification card, and for each correction of an official state 3 personal identification card, beginning July 1, 2021, an individual 4 shall apply for renewal of the official state personal 5 6 identification card and pay the renewal fee prescribed in this act 7 if the official state personal identification card was due to 8 expire within the next 12 months. Except as otherwise provided in 9 this act, an official state personal identification card renewed under this subsection or subsection (24) must be renewed for the 10 11 combined period of the time remaining on the official state 12 personal identification card before its renewal and the 4-year 13 renewal period. 14 (26) Notwithstanding subsection (13), an official state 15 personal identification card that expires on or after March 1, 2020 16 is considered valid until March 31, 2021. Notwithstanding 17 subsection (13), an official state personal identification card that expires after March 31, 2021 but before August 1, 2021 is 18 19 considered valid until 120 days after the date of the expiration. 20 If the secretary of state receives an application to renew an 21 official state personal identification card that expires on or after March 1, 2020 before March 31, 2021, the secretary of state 22 23 shall process the application as a renewal of an existing official state personal identification card. If the secretary of state 24 25 receives an application to renew an official state personal 26 identification card that expires after March 31, 2021 but before 27 August 1, 2021, the secretary of state shall process the application as a renewal of an existing official state personal 28 29 identification card until 120 days after the date of the

- 1 expiration. After the secretary of state develops or enters into a
- 2 contract to develop the mobile license system under section 310a of
- 3 the Michigan vehicle code, 1949 PA 300, MCL 257.310a, on request of
- 4 an individual issued a physical official state personal
- 5 identification card under this section, the secretary of state may
- 6 issue a mobile official state personal identification card to the
- 7 individual. The secretary of state shall ensure that any data
- 8 elements in the mobile official state personal identification card
- 9 match the data elements contained in the records of the department
- 10 of state. The secretary of state shall not issue or renew a mobile
- 11 official state personal identification card to an individual who
- 12 does not hold a valid physical official state personal
- 13 identification card. On request of a police officer or relying
- 14 party, an individual may present the individual's mobile official
- 15 state personal identification card on the electronic device on
- 16 which the mobile official state personal identification card is
- 17 provisioned. The secretary of state may provision an individual's
- 18 mobile official state personal identification card to multiple
- 19 electronic devices through the mobile license system developed
- 20 under section 310a of the Michigan vehicle code, 1949 PA 300, MCL
- 21 257.310a. The secretary of state shall regularly update an
- 22 individual's information in a mobile official state personal
- 23 identification card and set the validity period of a mobile
- 24 official state personal identification card. The fee for an
- 25 original or renewal mobile official state personal identification
- 26 card must not be more than \$4.00. The secretary of state shall
- 27 deposit the money collected under this subsection in the mobile
- 28 license fund created under section 811c(2) of the Michigan vehicle
- 29 code, 1949 PA 300, MCL 257.811c.

- 1 (27) As used in this section:
- 2 (a) "Communication impediment" means an individual has a
- 3 health condition that may impede communication with a police
- 4 officer, including, but not limited to, any of the following:
- 5 (i) Deafness or hearing loss.
- 6 (ii) An autism spectrum disorder.
- 7 (b) "Data elements" means a distinct component of an
- 8 individual's information that is found on the records of the
- 9 department of state.
- 10 (c) (b) "Emergency contact information" means the name,
- 11 telephone number, or address of an individual that is used for the
- 12 sole purpose of contacting that individual when the holder of an
- 13 official state personal identification card has been involved in an
- 14 emergency.
- 15 (d) "Provision" means that term as defined in section 310a of
- 16 the Michigan vehicle code, 1949 PA 300, MCL 257.310a.
- 17 (e) "Relying party" means that term as defined in section 3 of
- 18 the relying parties on mobile licenses act.
- 19 (f) "Validity period" means that term as defined in section
- 20 310a of the Michigan vehicle code, 1949 PA 300, MCL 257.310a.
- 21 Enacting section 1. This amendatory act does not take effect
