SENATE BILL NO. 618

October 22, 2025, Introduced by Senators GEISS, ANTHONY, SHINK and CAVANAGH and referred to Committee on Transportation and Infrastructure.

A bill to amend 2008 PA 23, entitled

"Enhanced driver license and enhanced official state personal identification card act,"

by amending sections 2 and 4 (MCL 28.302 and 28.304), section 4 as amended by 2024 PA 114.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 2. As used in this act:
- 2 (a) "Enhanced driver license" means an operator's or
- 3 chauffeur's license issued under this act to an individual under

- this act who is a United States citizen and who resides in this 1 2 state for the following purposes:
- 3 (i) Use in entering the United States at land and sea ports.
- 4 (ii) Use in the same manner as a standard driver physical 5 operator's or chauffeur's license.
- 6 (b) "Enhanced official state personal identification card" 7 means an official state personal identification card issued under 8 this act to an individual who is a United States citizen and who 9 resides in this state for the following purposes:
 - (i) Use in entering the United States at land and sea ports.
- 11 (ii) Use in the same manner as a standard physical official 12 state personal identification card.
- (c) "Local government agency" means a county, city, village, 13 or township in this state.
- (d) "Resident" means every person who resides in this state 15 16 and establishes that he or she is legally present in the United 17 States. This definition applies to the provisions of this act only.
- 18 (e) "Resident address" means the place that is a person's 19 legal residence as that term is defined in section 11 of the Michigan election law, 1954 PA 116, MCL 168.11. 20
- 21 (f) "Standard driver license" means an operator's license or 22 chauffeur's license issued under the Michigan vehicle code, 1949 PA 23 300, MCL 257.1 to 257.923.
- 24 (d) "Mobile enhanced driver license" means a mobile operator's or chauffeur's license issued under this act to an individual who 25 is a United States citizen and who resides in this state for the 26 27 following purposes:
 - (i) Use in entering the United States at land and sea ports.
- 29 (ii) Use in the same manner as a mobile operator's or

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- 1 chauffeur's license.
- 2 (e) "Mobile enhanced official state personal identification
- 3 card" means a mobile official state personal identification card
- 4 issued under this act to an individual who is a United States
- 5 citizen and who resides in this state for the following purposes:
- 6 (i) Use in entering the United States at land and sea ports.
- 7 (ii) Use in the same manner as a mobile official state personal 8 identification card.
- 9 (f) "Mobile official state personal identification card" means
- 10 a mobile official state personal identification card issued under
- 11 section 2 of 1972 PA 222, MCL 28.292.
- 12 (g) "Mobile operator's or chauffeur's license" means a mobile
- 13 operator's or chauffeur's license issued under section 310a of the
- 14 Michigan vehicle code, 1949 PA 300, MCL 257.310a.
- 15 (h) (g) "Standard official state personal identification card"
- 16 "Physical official state personal identification card" means an
- 17 official state personal identification card issued under 1972 PA
- 18 222, MCL 28.291 to 28.300.
- 19 (i) "Physical operator's or chauffeur's license" means an
- 20 operator's or chauffeur's license issued under the Michigan vehicle
- 21 code, 1949 PA 300, MCL 257.1 to 257.923.
- 22 (j) "Residence address" means the place that is an
- 23 individual's residence as that term is defined in section 11 of the
- 24 Michigan election law, 1954 PA 116, MCL 168.11.
- 25 (k) "Resident" means an individual who resides in this state
- 26 and establishes that the individual is legally present in the
- 27 United States. This definition applies to the provisions of this
- 28 act only.
- 29 Sec. 4. (1) The secretary of state may issue an enhanced

- 1 driver license or enhanced official state personal identification
- 2 card to an applicant who provides satisfactory proof of the
- 3 applicant's full legal name, United States citizenship, identity,
- 4 date of birth, Social Security number, residence address, and a
- 5 photographic identity document. Beginning June 27, 2021, if the
- 6 applicant is a program participant in the address confidentiality
- 7 program under the address confidentiality program act, 2020 PA 301,
- 8 MCL 780.851 to 780.873, the applicant shall present to the
- 9 secretary of state the applicant's participation card issued under
- 10 the address confidentiality program act, 2020 PA 301, MCL 780.851
- 11 to 780.873. An applicant may choose to apply for a standard driver
- 12 physical operator's or chauffeur's license or standard physical
- 13 official state personal identification card or an enhanced driver
- 14 license or enhanced official state personal identification card.
- 15 (2) An enhanced driver license or enhanced official state
- 16 personal identification card must include reasonable security
- 17 measures to protect against unauthorized disclosure of personal
- 18 information regarding residents of this state that is contained in
- 19 the enhanced driver license or enhanced official state personal
- 20 identification card.
- 21 (3) An enhanced driver license or enhanced official state
- 22 personal identification card may include radio frequency
- 23 identification technology that is limited to a randomly assigned
- 24 number that must be encrypted if agreed to by the United States
- 25 Department of Homeland Security, and does not include biometric
- 26 data. The secretary of state shall ensure that the radio frequency
- 27 identification technology is secure from unauthorized data access
- 28 and includes reasonable security measures to protect against
- 29 unauthorized disclosure of personal information. An applicant must

- 1 sign a declaration acknowledging the applicant's understanding of
- 2 the radio frequency identification technology before the applicant
- 3 is issued an enhanced driver license or enhanced official state
- 4 personal identification card.
- 5 (4) After the secretary of state develops or enters into a 6 contract to develop the mobile license system under section 310a of 7 the Michigan vehicle code, 1949 PA 300, MCL 257.310a, on request of 8 an individual issued an enhanced driver license or enhanced 9 official state personal identification card under subsection (1), 10 the secretary of state may issue a mobile enhanced driver license 11 or mobile enhanced official state personal identification card to 12 the individual. The secretary of state shall ensure that any data 13 elements in the mobile enhanced driver license or mobile enhanced 14 official state personal identification card match the data elements 15 contained in the records of the department of state. The secretary of state shall not issue or renew a mobile enhanced driver license 16 17 or mobile enhanced official state personal identification card to 18 an individual who does not hold a valid physical enhanced driver 19 license or physical enhanced official state personal identification 20 card. The secretary of state may provision an individual's mobile 21 enhanced driver license or mobile enhanced official state personal 22 identification card to multiple electronic devices through the 23 mobile license system developed under section 310a of the Michigan 24 vehicle code, 1949 PA 300, MCL 257.310a. The secretary of state 25 shall regularly update an individual's information contained in a 26 mobile enhanced driver license or mobile enhanced official state 27 personal identification card and set the validity period of a 28 mobile enhanced driver license or mobile enhanced official state 29 personal identification card. The fee for an original or renewal

- 1 mobile enhanced driver license or mobile enhanced official state
- 2 personal identification card must not be more than \$4.00. The
- 3 secretary of state shall deposit the money collected under this
- 4 subsection in the mobile license fund created under section 811c(2)
- 5 of the Michigan vehicle code, 1949 PA 300, MCL 257.811c.
- 6 (4) An enhanced driver license or enhanced official state
- 7 personal identification card that expires on or after March 1, 2020
- 8 is considered valid until March 31, 2021. An enhanced driver
- 9 license or enhanced official state personal identification card
- 10 that expires after March 31, 2021 but before August 1, 2021 is
- 11 valid until 120 days after the date of the expiration.
- 12 (5) The requirements of this act are in addition to the
- 13 requirements otherwise imposed on individuals who apply for a
- 14 standard driver physical operator's or chauffeur's license or
- 15 standard physical official state personal identification card,
- 16 mobile operator's or chauffeur's license, or mobile official state
- 17 personal identification card.
- 18 (6) The holder of an enhanced driver license or mobile
- 19 enhanced driver license issued under this act is subject to every
- 20 licensing sanction provided under the Michigan vehicle code, 1949
- 21 PA 300, MCL 257.1 to 257.923. As used in this subsection,
- 22 "licensing sanction" means the restriction, suspension, revocation,
- 23 or denial of a driver license; the addition of points to a driving
- 24 record; the assessment of a civil fine or criminal penalty
- 25 resulting from a conviction; a civil infraction determination; the
- 26 imposition of probationary terms and conditions; or any other
- 27 penalty provided under the Michigan vehicle code, 1949 PA 300, MCL
- 28 257.1 to 257.923. A requirement under this act to surrender,
- 29 destroy, or confiscate a license does not apply to the electronic

- 1 device on which a mobile enhanced driver license is provisioned.
- 2 Notwithstanding this subsection and on request of a police officer
- 3 or relying party, an individual may transmit the individual's
- 4 mobile enhanced driver license or mobile enhanced official state
- 5 personal identification card from the electronic device on which
- 6 the mobile enhanced driver license or mobile enhanced official
- 7 state personal identification card is provisioned.
- 8 (7) Beginning June 27, 2021, upon on receipt of a notice from
- 9 the department of the attorney general that an individual who has
- 10 been issued an enhanced driver license or enhanced official state
- 11 personal identification card under this act has been certified as a
- 12 program participant in the address confidentiality program, the
- 13 secretary of state shall issue a corrected enhanced driver license
- 14 or enhanced official state personal identification card to that
- 15 individual by mailing the license or card to the individual's
- 16 designated address. Beginning June 27, 2021, an enhanced driver
- 17 license or enhanced official state personal identification card
- 18 issued under this subsection or subsection (1) to a program
- 19 participant must display the individual's designated address and
- 20 must not display the individual's residence address. The
- 21 requirements of this subsection are in addition to the requirements
- 22 for individuals who are issued a corrected standard driver physical
- 23 operator's or chauffeur's license under section 310f of the
- 24 Michigan vehicle code, 1949 PA 300, MCL 257.310f, or a corrected
- 25 official state personal identification card under section 2a of
- 26 1972 PA 222, MCL 28.292a.
- 27 (8) If an individual presents evidence of statutory blindness
- 28 as provided in 1978 PA 260, MCL 393.351 to 393.368, and is issued
- 29 or is the holder of an enhanced official state personal

- 1 identification card, the secretary of state shall mark the
- 2 individual's enhanced official state personal identification card
- 3 in a manner that clearly indicates that the cardholder is legally
- 4 blind. A mobile enhanced official state personal identification
- 5 card issued under this section may contain a text-based indicator,
- 6 code, or other indicator approved by the secretary of state to
- 7 indicate that the holder of the enhanced official state personal
- 8 identification card is legally blind.
- 9 (9) A mobile enhanced driver license or mobile enhanced
- 10 official state personal identification card issued under this
- 11 section may contain a text-based indicator, code, or other
- 12 indicator approved by the secretary of state to indicate that the
- 13 holder of a mobile enhanced driver license or an enhanced official
- 14 state personal identification card is deaf.
- 15 (10) A mobile enhanced driver license or mobile enhanced
- 16 official state personal identification card issued under this
- 17 section may contain a heart insignia, code, text-based indicator,
- 18 or other indicator approved by the secretary of state to indicate
- 19 that the holder of a mobile enhanced driver license or mobile
- 20 enhanced official state personal identification card wishes to
- 21 participate in the anatomical gift donor registry under part 101 of
- 22 the public health code, 1978 PA 368, MCL 333.10101 to 333.10123.
- 23 (11) $\frac{(8)}{}$ As used in this section:
- 24 (a) "Address confidentiality program" means a program as that
- 25 term is defined in section 3 of the address confidentiality program
- 26 act, 2020 PA 301, MCL 780.853.
- 27 (b) "Data elements" means a distinct component of an
- 28 individual's information that is found on the records of the
- 29 department of state.

- 1 (c) (b)—"Designated address" means that term as defined in
- 2 section 3 of the address confidentiality program act, 2020 PA 301,
- **3** MCL 780.853.
- 4 (d) (c) "Program participant" means that term as defined in
- 5 section 3 of the address confidentiality program act, 2020 PA 301,
- 6 MCL 780.853.
- 7 (e) "Provision" means that term as defined in section 310a of 8 the Michigan vehicle code, 1949 PA 300, MCL 257.310a.
- 9 (f) "Relying party" means that term as defined in section 3 of 10 the relying parties on mobile licenses act.
- 11 (g) "Validity period" means that term as defined in section 12 310a of the Michigan vehicle code, 1949 PA 300, MCL 257.310a.
- 13 Enacting section 1. This amendatory act does not take effect
