SENATE BILL NO. 634

October 30, 2025, Introduced by Senator ALBERT and referred to Committee on Government Operations.

A bill to amend 1978 PA 472, entitled

"An act to regulate political activity; to regulate lobbyists, lobbyist agents, and lobbying activities; to require registration of lobbyists and lobbyist agents; to require the filing of reports; to prescribe the powers and duties of the department of state; to prescribe penalties; and to repeal certain acts and parts of acts,"

by amending section 5 (MCL 4.415), as amended by 1986 PA 83.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 5. (1) "Governmental body" means a state legislative or
- 2 governing body, including a board, commission, committee,
- 3 subcommittee, authority, or council, that may, under the state

- 1 constitution, a statute, or a rule, exercise governmental or
- 2 proprietary authority or perform a governmental or proprietary
- 3 function, or a lessee of the body that performs an essential public
- 4 purpose and function under the lease agreement.
- 5 (2) "Influencing" means promoting, supporting, affecting,
- 6 modifying, opposing, or delaying by any means, including the
- 7 providing of or use of information, statistics, studies, or
- 8 analysis.
- 9 (3) "Legislative action" means introduction, sponsorship,
- 10 support, opposition, consideration, debate, vote, passage, defeat,
- 11 approval, veto, delay, or an official action by an official in the
- 12 executive branch or an official in the legislative branch on a
- 13 bill, resolution, amendment, nomination, appointment, report, or
- 14 any matter pending or proposed in a legislative committee or either
- 15 house of the legislature. Legislative action does not include the
- 16 representation of a person who that has been subpoenaed to appear
- 17 before the legislature or an agency of the legislature.
- 18 (4) (2) "Lobbying" means communicating directly with an
- 19 official in the executive branch of state government or an official
- 20 in the legislative branch of state government for the purpose of
- 21 influencing legislative or administrative action. Lobbying does not
- 22 include the providing provision of technical information by a
- 23 person, other than a person as defined in subsection (5) lobbyist
- 24 agent or an employee of a person as defined in subsection (5) when
- 25 appearing before lobbyist agent, to an officially convened
- 26 legislative committee or executive department hearing panel. As
- 27 used in this subsection, "technical information" means empirically
- 28 verifiable data provided by a person recognized as an expert in the
- 29 subject area to which the information provided is related.

- - (5) (4) "Lobbyist" means any of the following:
- 6 (a) A person whose expenditures for lobbying are more than
 7 \$1,000.00 in value in any 12-month period. For the purpose of this
 8 subdivision and subdivision (b), groups of 25 or more people shall
 9 not have their personal expenditures for food, travel, and beverage
 10 included if those expenditures are not reimbursed by a lobbyist or
 11 lobbyist agent.
 - (b) A person whose expenditures for lobbying are more than \$250.00 in value in any 12-month period, if the amount is expended on lobbying a single public official.
 - (c) For the purpose of subdivisions (a) and (b), groups of 25 or more people shall not have their personal expenditures for food, travel, and beverage included, providing those expenditures are not reimbursed by a lobbyist or lobbyist agent.
 - (c) (d) The This state or a political subdivision which of this state that contracts for a lobbyist agent.
 - (6) (5)—"Lobbyist agent" means a person who that receives compensation or reimbursement of actual expenses, or both, in a combined amount in excess of \$250.00 in any 12-month period for lobbying.

- 27 (a) An employee of the lobbyist or lobbyist agent.
- 28 (b) For purposes of section 8(1)(b)(i) and 9(1)(b), a member

- 5 (a) The governor, lieutenant governor, secretary of state, or

 12 Michigan legislative retirement system, or any other employee of
 13 the legislature other than an individual employed by the this state
 14 in a clerical or nonpolicy-making non-policy-making capacity.
 - (11) "Governmental body" means any state legislative or governing body, including a board, commission, committee, subcommittee, authority, or council, which is empowered by state constitution, statute, or rule to exercise governmental or proprietary authority or perform a governmental or proprietary function, or a lessee thereof performing an essential public purpose and function under the lease agreement.
 - (11) "Representative of the lobbyist" means any of the following:
 - (a) An employee of the lobbyist or lobbyist agent.
- 25 (b) For purposes of sections 8(1)(b)(i) and 9(1)(b), a member 26 of the lobbyist or employee of a member of the lobbyist, if the 27 lobbyist is a membership organization or association and the member 28 or employee of the member is present during any part of the period 29 during which the purchased food or beverage is consumed.

- (c) A person that is reimbursed by the lobbyist or lobbyist agent for an expenditure, other than an expenditure for food or beverage, that was incurred for the purpose of lobbying.
- Enacting section 1. This amendatory act does not take effect unless Senate Bill No. 631 of the 103rd Legislature is enacted into law.
