HOUSE SUBSTITUTE FOR SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

NO. 7

A concurrent resolution urging the United States Congress to

2 immediately reopen the federal government by passing a clean 3 continuing resolution. 4 Whereas, The United States government has been shut down for more than 29 days, marking the second longest shutdown in our 5 6 nation's history; and 7 Whereas, The damaging impacts of the federal government 8 shutdown are being felt across Michigan. Shutdowns result in most federal workers being furloughed or required to work without pay, 9 and there are around 56,000 federal workers across our state. This 10 11 prolonged shutdown could result in thousands of families struggling 12 to make ends meet; and

Whereas, Our 1.3 million active-duty military personnel are 1 bravely protecting and serving our country, not knowing if they 2 will receive their next paycheck; and 3 Whereas, The shutdown disrupts critical services, such as food 4 assistance programs, likely causing immediate and lasting harm: 5 6 seniors will skip meals, children will go hungry, individuals with 7 disabilities will have to pick between medication and eating, families will be forced to choose between putting food on the table 8 9 and paying rent, and resource-strained communities will struggle 10 with increased demand on food banks and emergency services; and Whereas, There have now been 13 blocked attempts to reopen the 11 12 federal government; and Whereas, From 2021 to 2024, there were 13 separate short-term 13 14 funding measures enacted by Congress; and 15 Whereas, Members of Congress who continue to allow this 16 shutdown to persist should recognize these real and immediate harms 17 and understand that partisan disagreements should not come at the 18 expense of the American people. Differences in policy and spending 19 priorities can and should be debated after reopening the 20 government; and Whereas, The state of Michigan has demonstrated the ability to 21 prioritize people over politics. Despite deep differences in 22 23 spending priorities, the Representatives and Senators of the 24 Michigan Legislature worked together to reconfigure state budgets 25 and delivered greater value for taxpayers while achieving earmark reform and rooting out waste, fraud, and abuse; and 26 27 Whereas, Michigan's leaders have shown that this important 28 work can continue while the government is operating. By adopting a 29 temporary stopgap measure, Michigan was able to pass a responsible,

bipartisan, and balanced budget that reduced spending from the 1 previous year without jeopardizing vital public services; and 2 Whereas, No one wins in a government shutdown. Every day that 3 the federal government remains closed is another day of unnecessary 4 hardship for American families, public servants, and communities 5 6 across the nation; now, therefore, be it 7 Resolved by the Senate (the House of Representatives 8 concurring), That we urge the United States Congress to take immediate action to reopen the federal government by passing a 9 10 clean continuing resolution and to do right by the American people; 11 and be it further Resolved, That copies of this resolution be transmitted to the 12 Speaker of the United States House of Representatives, the Minority 13 Leader of the United States House of Representatives, the Majority 14 15 and Minority Leaders of the United States Senate, and the members of the Michigan congressional delegation. 16
