Reps. Martus, Hope, Andrews, Paiz, Longjohn, Skaggs, Breen, Glanville, MacDonell, Miller, Rogers, Weiss, Witwer, Wooden and Xiong offered the following resolution:

- 1 A resolution to declare November 10-16, 2025, as Michigan
- 2 Historical Music Week in the state of Michigan.
- 3 Whereas, Michigan has made a profound and lasting impact on
- 4 American and global music, producing transformative artists,
- 5 pioneering new genres, and shaping cultural movements that resonate
- 6 across generations; and
- 7 Whereas, Michigan is the birthplace of Motown, founded by
- 8 Berry Gordy in Detroit, which became one of the most successful and
- 9 influential music labels in history. In the 1960s alone, Motown
- 10 artists achieved seventy-nine Billboard Top 100 hits, elevating
- 11 Black artists into the mainstream and bringing messages of unity,
- 12 soul, and love to homes around the world; and

         Whereas, Michigan's musical heritage spans gospel, jazz, folk,
    country, R&B, soul, and blues, with influential artists such as

- 22 venues to observe this week with appropriate programs, events, and
- 23 educational activities recognizing Michigan's rich musical
