Reps. Hall, DeBoer, DeSana, Fox, Greene, Jenkins-Arno and Rigas offered the following resolution:

- 1 A resolution to urge the United States Senate to immediately
- 2 pass a clean continuing resolution to reopen the federal
- 3 government.

- 4 Whereas, The federal government shutdown has now stretched
- 5 beyond 35 days, bringing hardship to millions of Michiganders and
- 6 marking the longest shutdown in United States history; and
- 7 Whereas, While Michigan families are tightening their belts,
- 8 Senate Democrats in Washington are tightening their grip on
- 9 gridlock. The government shutdown, now dragging into its second
- 10 month, isn't just a headline. It's a punch in the gut to every
- 11 Michigan worker, every small business owner, and every military
- 12 family wondering if their next paycheck will come; and
- 13 Whereas, The shutdown poses disruptions to critical services

such as food assistance programs, impediments to public safety in 1 our airports, and administrative delays with Medicare, Social 2 3 Security, and Veterans Affairs benefits; and 4 Whereas, Despite these serious and growing consequences, 5 Michigan Senators Gary Peters and Elissa Slotkin and Senate 6 Minority Leader Chuck Schumer have failed 14 times to approve a 7 clean continuing resolution that would reopen the government and 8 protect families from further harm. United States Senate rules 9 require a three-fifths supermajority vote to invoke cloture, 10 allowing the chamber to hold a vote on the continuing resolution. 11 To date, the requisite number of Senate Democrats have refused to 12 vote in favor of this motion. The continued inaction of Senate Democrat leadership has unnecessarily prolonged this government 13 14 shutdown; and 15 Whereas, The Committee for a Responsible Federal Budget 16 estimates that the counterproposal authored by Democrats to end the 17 shutdown for one month in exchange for various policy changes would add 1,500,000,000,000 dollars to the national debt over the next 18 19 decade. This list of demands includes healthcare subsidies for 20 illegal immigrants and certain non-U.S. citizens, allowing able-21 bodied adults without dependents to receive Medicaid benefits 22 without seeking a job or enrolling in school, and permanently 23 extending COVID-19-era tax credits that are propping up a failing 24 healthcare system that is desperately in need of reform; and 25 Whereas, While the people of Michigan expect cooperation and problem-solving from their elected officials, partisan 26 27 grandstanding in Washington has replaced leadership with political 28 theater; and

Whereas, The Michigan Legislature has demonstrated that, even

with divided government, it is possible to reach agreement on 1 balanced, responsible budgets that serve the people first, proof 2 that principled compromise and effective governance are achievable 3 when leaders put citizens ahead of radical party politics; and 4 5 Whereas, When Minority Leader Chuck Schumer said, "Every day 6 gets better for us," he clearly wasn't talking about the people of 7 Michigan. Every additional day the federal government remains shut 8 down means more missed paychecks, delayed benefits, and uncertainty 9 for families, farmers, service members, and small businesses across 10 Michigan and the nation; now, therefore, be it 11 Resolved by the House of Representatives, That we urge the United States Senate to take immediate bipartisan action to pass a 12 clean continuing resolution to reopen the federal government, 13 14 restore stability to Michigan families, and put an end to this 15 unnecessary hardship; and be it further 16 Resolved, That, to end the government shutdown and alleviate the pain being felt across our state and our nation, we urge the 17 18 United States Senate to pursue any and all available pathways to immediately initiate a vote on a clean continuing resolution; and 19 be it further 20 Resolved, That copies of this resolution be transmitted to the 21 Majority and Minority Leaders of the United States Senate and 22

United States Senators Gary Peters and Elissa Slotkin.
