SENATE RESOLUTION NO. 80

Senators Webber, Polehanki, Runestad, Shink, Bellino, Bayer, Chang, McMorrow, Huizenga, Wojno, Moss and Theis offered the following resolution:

- 1 A resolution to recognize the historic, cultural, and
- 2 religious significance of the festival of Diwali.
- 3 Whereas, Diwali is celebrated annually every autumn by Hindus,
- 4 Sikhs, and Jains in Michigan, the United States, and throughout the
- 5 world, with over one billion celebrants marking the holiday; and
- 6 Whereas, Diwali is a holy day, during which celebrants light
- 7 small oil lamps and place them around the home. The lighting of the
- 8 lamps is followed by prayers for attainment of health, wealth,
- 9 knowledge, peace, and valor, and is recognized as the beginning of
- 10 a new year for some Hindus; and
- 11 Whereas, "Diwali" is a shortened version of the Sanskrit word
- 12 "Deepavali," which means a row of lamps, and in English is referred

to as the "festival of lights;" and 1 2 Whereas, Celebrants of Diwali believe that the rows of lamps symbolize the light within the individual that rids the soul of the 3 darkness of ignorance; and 4 Whereas, For Hindus, Diwali is a celebration of the belief 5 6 that light triumphs over darkness and good triumphs over evil; and 7 Whereas, For Sikhs, Diwali is feted as the day that the sixth 8 founding Sikh Guru, or revered teacher, Guru Hargobind, was released from captivity by the Mughal Emperor Jehangir; and 9 10 Whereas, For Jains, Diwali marks the anniversary of the attainment of moksha or liberation by Lord Mahavira, the last of 11 the Tirthankaras, who was the great teacher of Jain Dharma at the 12 end of his life in 527 B.C.; and 13 Whereas, Michigan remains resolute in its commitment to 14 15 fostering diversity of experience and religious acceptance; and 16 Whereas, Diwali is a time marked by qualities of togetherness, family, and community; now, therefore, be it 17 18 Resolved by the Senate, That the members of this legislative body recognize the historic, cultural, and religious significance 19 20 of the festival of Diwali. We recognize the Diwali message of tolerance, compassion, and acceptance of others which resonates 21 with the ideals of the American spirit; and be it further 22 23 Resolved, That we express respect and admiration to all those 24 who celebrate Diwali throughout the world and in our own
