SENATE RESOLUTION NO. 82

Senators Brinks, Chang and Polehanki offered the following resolution:

- 1 A resolution to condemn political violence in all forms,
- 2 regardless of political party or ideology, and affirm the
- 3 commitment of the Michigan Senate to peaceful dispute resolution
- 4 through lawful, democratic means.
- 5 Whereas, Robust debate, freedom of expression, civic
- 6 participation, fair elections, and the peaceful exchange of ideas
- 7 are the basis for democracy, all of which become endangered when
- 8 violence is used as a political weapon; and
- 9 Whereas, Political violence includes a wide range of actions,
- 10 from symbolic intimidation to lethal attacks, and seeks to
- 11 undermine public institutions, reduce trust, and suppress political
- 12 participation; and
- 13 Whereas, According to research from the University of

- 1 Maryland, there were approximately 150 politically motivated
- 2 attacks in the United States during the first six months of 2025,
- 3 nearly doubling the number of attacks seen over the same period in
- 4 2024; and
- 5 Whereas, Political violence impacts individuals across the
- 6 political spectrum at the federal, state, and local level, as well
- 7 as journalists, activists, and public figures; and
- 8 Whereas, Proponents of political violence seek to suppress
- 9 free speech and debate by creating a climate of fear and
- 10 intimidation in hopes of stifling civic participation from
- 11 constituents, public figures, and activists; and
- 12 Whereas, The Michigan Senate values the right of Michiganders
- 13 to freely express themselves and feel safe when doing so, as civic
- 14 engagement is crucial for a successful democracy; and
- 15 Whereas, We urge law enforcement authorities at all levels to
- 16 thoroughly investigate, prosecute, and hold accountable those who
- 17 commit to incite political violence; and
- 18 Whereas, The Michigan Senate commends law enforcement and all
- 19 public officials who work to respond to such violence; and
- 20 Whereas, We condemn actions and rhetoric that is intended to
- 21 harass, intimidate, silence, and dehumanize public officials,
- 22 political candidates, public figures, and their respective family
- 23 members and staff; now, therefore, be it
- 24 Resolved by the Senate, That the members of this legislative
- 25 body condemn political violence in all forms, regardless of
- 26 political party or ideology, and affirm the commitment of the
- 27 Michigan Senate to peaceful dispute resolution through lawful,
- 28 democratic means.
